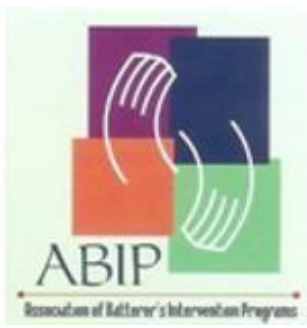

Presenter Bios

Edward Jacobs- Edward has been facilitating Domestic Violence groups since 2019. He holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from UCLA, and a law degree from University of San Diego School of Law. He is certified by ABIP.

Dean Eddy – Started In the filed back in 1992 with Southern California counseling center, under the supervision of George Thomas, who was one of the founding members of ABIP. In 1997 Dean became the director of client services for abuse prevention program (TAPP) though 2016. Dean and three of his colleagues formed a nonprofit called Peaceful Solutions where he taught groups until 2024 when doors closed. Dean has been working for LACADA for the last 18 years, is a certified provider for batterer intervention programming, is a current member of ABIP since 1993 and is a current board member.

Michael Cochrane, MBA - Michael has spent twenty-nine years as a DV facilitator/co-facilitator, facilitating Men's DV Group at Foothill Family Services and at Management 411. He also has expertise in intervention techniques for partner abuse, targeting self-esteem issues, rage, and anger. He also works with interpersonal family issues and specializes in various ethnic cultural issues. Michael is also a long-time ABIP Board Member and current Co-Chair.

Isabella Goeders, MS - Isabella is an MFT intern at the Chinatown Service Center in Los Angeles where she is a therapist working with families, parenting classes, and as a DV facilitator. She was one of the founding members of the Asian Pacific Islander DV Task Force in 2004. Isabella was one of the recipients of the 2013 Woman of the Year for her years of volunteer and advocate work done with DV victims.

Maria Levya - Maria has over 30 years of experience working at Jewish Family Services and the LAPD assisting the domestic violence response team. She also founded the Children Safety Alliance Group (TCSA) which provides professional supervised visits to assist families going through divorce or separation to reunite with their children, Maria also founded the Community Safety Alliance Group which is a family support and training agency. Her goal is to work with the justice system to assist our community with education to maintain families and avoid family separation.

Stephen Lasicka - Stephen is a SUDCC III and has worked in AOD treatment for fourteen+ years. He previously facilitated and instructed batterers intervention, anger management, and drug diversion at Tarzana Treatment Centers and alcohol/drug education counseling at Driver Safety School. He was previously involved in facilitator training at Homeboy Industries. His education includes a BA from UCLA, JD Loyola Law, and Addiction Studies certification at LA Pierce College.

Alyce La Violette, MS, MFT - Alyce founded Alternatives to Violence in 1979 and has worked with battered women since 1978. Alyce is both a national and international speaker and trainer, an expert witness and best-selling author for Sage Publications with the 3rd edition of her book *It Could Happen to Anyone: Why Women Stay* (available on Amazon).

Cecelia Walker - Cecelia has worked in the field for 17 years, a survivor in recovery since 2002. Her lived experience informs her passion for equitable, appropriate services for those in need. In 2004, she volunteered at Haven House and was later hired as a Housing Case Manager and Outreach Advocate for Angel Step Inn DV Emergency Shelter. She holds a BA in sociology and MS in Human Services, certified substance abuse counselor, and is co-chair of the Religion & Domestic Violence Committee of the Los Angeles DV Council, member of the DV Alliance, LA Regional Policy Committee, and Community Action Network.
